I. Introduction

3. **Rebellion**

- Forgetting origins and spiritual upbringing can lead to rebellion.
- Saul's downfall due to forgetfulness (1 Samuel 15:17).
- Call to humility and service in remembering who has spiritually nurtured us.

IV. Key Teachings

- Communion is about remembering Christ's sacrifice, not personal needs.
- Forgetfulness leads to spiritual failure, lack of gratitude, and rebellion.
- Gratitude is expressed through active remembrance and honor.

V. Applications

- Write down and reflect on spiritual blessings regularly.
- Honor your spiritual leaders with prayers and support.
- Serve in your church with humility and remember your salvation story.
- Regularly take communion with an understanding heart.

VI. Final Call

- Pray for a spirit of remembrance.
- Recognize and renounce pride and rebellion.
